Australian Government renewing 29 bridges across NSW

TWENTY-NINE bridges across New South Wales will be upgraded under the first tranche of the Australian Government's new \$300 million Bridges Renewal Programme.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development Warren Truss was in Dubbo today to announce that \$28.5 million in federal funds will be pumped into local NSW bridges – matched by funding proponents – to improve the state's road network.

"The Australian Government received over 100 proposals from New South Wales, highlighting the importance that bridges play in local communities," Mr Truss said.

"The Bridges Renewal Programme is designed to bolster productivity of Australia's local bridges, to better serve communities and drive greater efficiency in road freight and traffic movement.

"By upgrading these bridges from, for example, by replacing one-lane timber bridges with two-lane concrete bridges, residents will enjoy better, safer and more reliable road access. Freight from farms and local factories will be able to pass safely along quicker routes with greatly improve productivity.

"It's a classic win-win situation. That's why the Coalition Government identified local bridge upgrades and repairs as a national priority."

New South Wales Minister for Roads and Freight Duncan Gay said councils would play a vital role in delivering the upgrades.

"The value of these upgrades in small communities is directly reflected by the quality of proposals received from local councils, with 28 of the 29 NSW successful projects being from councils across the state," Mr Gay said.

"Councils will play a significant role in managing these projects, and in ensuring these bridges can continue to contribute to productivity and community access.

"One example is the Harpary Bridge near Narrabri, which on completion will improve access to the Maules Creek Coal Mine and the nearby agricultural area, ultimately contributing to NSW and the national economy."

The Australian Government is committing \$105 million over Round One of the Bridges Renewal programme, committing a total of \$300 million over five years from 2014-15.
